- Guest (30 Minutes)
 - o Chris Lynn, President & CEO, Seniors Resource Center
 - o Nonprofit in operation about 45 years; goal: supporting aging in place
 - Non-medical; day respite care program for alz/dementia carers, deepcleaning for hoarding issues
 - Serving Denver metro, ~3500 clients annually
 - Provide reference to faith communities, but don't depend on them
 - Well-known to other service providers for the elderly (much info-sharing)
 - o Big gap in funding
 - Services are free; funded by DRCOG, Older Americans Act being reauthorized at 2018 levels (no inflation adjustment) - expecting ~\$1M reduction annually
 - SB-24040 Bill requesting \$5M from state to help with funding gap didn't move forward
 - Might be possible to get city lobbying to push it forward again
 - o 3 main issues: Transportation, Housing, Food
 - Recent info gathering on needs; trans & housing too big to tackle, but think they can get traction on food
 - Workign with VoA to get congregate dining sites set up for food support & community; also provide nutrition counseling
 - Gap in views on who is an older adult
 - Greatest Gen mostly gone; "junior seniors" incoming
 - SRC had a big transportation division, but it lost ~\$1M / yr
 - Transferred to Via Transportation
 - Worked well, but Via struggling due to pandemic effects
 - o Wait-list closed, only providing essential (medical) transport
 - Some folks use Uber/Lyft, but many drivers not equipped for mobilityimpaired riders
 - Council will be looking at providing vouchers/coupons in strategic planning. Was cut from last budget, but lots of interest
 - Rural communities facing a lot of difficulties
 - o Homelessness act recent bill providing tax breaks for donation
 - o What board can do to help: encourage people to be neighborly
 - Who are the older adults in your neighborhood? Would they be comfortable asking you for help?
 - Messaging / campaign materials would be helpful
 - Support from Legacy Foundation would be great
 - More volunteering always helps
 - o Rich suggests keeping community building on our agenda
 - o Looking for new board members to support fresh thinking

- o Coral Gables "FreeB" free electric bus program
- o Needed: clearinghouse for volunteer services, both using & contributing
 - Information-gathering on landscape of service provision
- o Older adult volunteers
- o More 65+ than 18- in Colorado for the first time

- o City has not recently looked into providing it as a utility, no county programs to partner with
- o Big 3 (T-Mo, ATT, Verizon) have presence in city
- o Google Fiber and Intrepid Fiber Networks both have signed agreements with the City to build their fiber network in the Westminster. One other fiber network has shown interest in building their fiber network in Westminster, but have not yet signed an agreement with the City. The agreements do not give the City authority to tell them where to build their network; however, the agreement does authorize the City to dictate the build area for each permit (typically one neighborhood per permit) and the communication expectations to the public prior to starting work.
- o Google and Intrepid have submitted Internet Right Of Way (IROW) Permits for their first areas to build. It is expected that construction will begin in the early-summer of this year.
